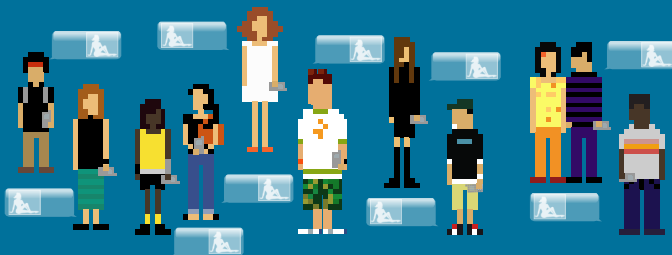
BEFORE YOU SEND A PHOTO OR VIDEO ASK YOURSELF

- Why do you want to send it?
- Who are you sending it to?
- What are the risks?
- Who might end up seeing it?
- What could happen to it?

Remember once a picture or video is shared it is impossible to get back.

IT COULD END UP ANYWHERE

For example it could be posted online where it can then be copied, changed and distributed without your knowledge.

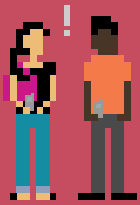

SEXTING CAN HAVE SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES



Did you know?

Sexting is a criminal offence. You could be criminalised and even potentially put on to the Sex Offender Register!

THE FACTS

It's illegal to sext with someone under the age of 18, as technically you are producing and distributing child pornography. By receiving and then sharing the pictures or videos you are at risk of being prosecuted, even if the picture is taken and shared with permission.

DO YOU KNOW

When applying for University or jobs they often do background checks on you, which could include criminal checks, Facebook or any other sites where your name is mentioned. This may affect the success of your application. Many countries requiring a visa will not let you travel with certain criminal convictions; these include America and Australia.
